The Role of Spanish Language in 5th Grade

By the end of this course, students will:

- **✓** Ask and answer questions using practiced sentence structures.
- ✓ Understand short, spoken and written Spanish in familiar contexts.
- **✓** Write short descriptive paragraphs, lists, and dialogue exchanges.
- **✓** Appreciate traditions and diversity across Spanish-speaking countries.
